Arrival & Dismissal

Parent drop off /pick up

Parents are to enter the parking lot on E. 144th street and follow the orange cones around to the drop off/pick up location. (Please adhere to the drop off and pick up locations. There are NO CAR pickups on the 146th

street side of the building! Help us keep dismissal safe and orderly)

Male Dress Code

- BLACK Pants No Jeans/Leggings/Joggers/Shorts
- Black Belt ONLY


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- Ties School issued ties must be worn at all times. Ties will be kept at school.
 White button-down shirt- Long or Short (WE DO NOT WEAR POLO STYLE SHIRTS)
 - Under shirt solid dark color only (no bright colors or logo t-shirts). T-shirt should match shirt length.
- **BLAZERS** Will be kept at school. The blazer must be worn at all times. (6-8)
- SWEATER VESTS NAVY BLUE ONLY (Grades K-5). The school has a monogramed vest available for purchase. The vest must always be worn.



- SOCKS –Solid black or white must be worn.
- SHOES BLACK DRESS SHOES ONLY. EXCEPTIONS: SPERRY'S
 OR ALL BLACK VANS. NO GYM SHOES OR BOOTS can be worn
 during school outside of PE class.
- JEWELRY Scholars are permitted to wear studs for earrings (one per ear) and wristwatches are permitted; otherwise no other jewelry (including body piercing jewelry) of any kind can be shown or is permitted.

Female Dress Code

- BLACK Pants No Jeans/Leggings/Joggers/Shorts (NO LEGGINGS/NO YOGA PANTS/NO JEGGINGS)
- BLACK SKIRTS The black skirt must fall two inches below the knee. Girls must wear shorts under skirts on days designated for physical activity.



- Black Belt ONLY
- Ties School issued ties must be worn at all times. Ties will be kept at school.
- White button-down shirt- Long or Short (WE DO NOT WEAR POLO STYLE SHIRTS)
 - o Under shirt solid dark color only (no bright colors or logo t-shirts). T-shirt should match shirt length.
- **BLAZERS** Will be kept at school. The jacket must be worn at all times. (6-8)
- SWEATER VESTS/CARDIGANS NAVY BLUE ONLY (Grades K-5). The school has a monogramed vest available for purchase. The vest must always be worn.
- SOCKS/TIGHTS –Solid black or white must be worn. (NO LEGGINGS/NO YOGA PANTS/NO JEGGINGS)
- SHOES BLACK DRESS SHOES ONLY, EXCEPTIONS: SPERRY'S OR ALL BLACK VANS. NO GYM SHOES OR BOOTS can be worn during
 school outside of PE class.
- **JEWELRY** Conservative jewelry is permitted. Some necklaces of any material, bracelets, rings, earrings, nose rings, piercing and anklets may be prohibited. Earrings must be the size of a quarter or smaller. No tongue rings.

Consequences for failure to wear uniform include but are not limited to: Reminders letters (3x), conference with school administration, detention, suspension and/or potential removal from Lake Erie Preparatory school.

Acquiring sight words is an important part of learning how to read. As such it is a focal point for your





scholar's teachers. These will be tracked throughout the year and communications sent home regarding your scholar's progress.

- Kindergarten scholars should be able to identify at least 50 words by the end of the school year.
- 1st grade scholars should be able to identify at least 100 words by the end of the school year.
- 2nd grade scholars should be able to identify at least 220 words by the end of the school year.
- 3rd grade scholars should be able to identify at least 300 words by the end of the school year.

Parent Corner:

MATH

This isn't the math WE grew up on!!!!

That's right common core math looks at the logic BEHIND the student answer choice. Often times wanting scholars to SHOW HOW they came up with the answer.

To help parents address questions children may have about *Eureka Math* at home, we have provided the Parent Tip Sheets (K—8) that provide an overview of each topic. These tip sheets include suggested strategies and models, key vocabulary, connections to previous learning, and tips for how you can support your child's learning at home. 
